




Inclement Weather Closures

We don't always think of the brain and heart being intimately connected, but they are. When we talk about a heart attack we need to also think about the possibility of a stroke and if someone has a stroke, we need to look at what might be going on in their heart. We have a simple saying that, "If it is good for the heart, then it is also good for the brain." First it is never too early to start to eliminate bad habits and acquire more good habits. Know your blood pressure and control it. There are new strict guidelines. A little bit of hypertension is generally, not OK. If you smoke- STOP! Treat elevated cholesterol, which means having it checked at a young age. If you drink alcohol, do so only in moderation. Control diabetes mellitus. Develop a regular exercise routine of at least 150 minutes each week of walking or activities that raise your heart rate. Eat a sensible diet and if you are overweight, it is time to get serious about weight loss. There is not one special diet, but portion control is a good place to start. Check with your doctor about whether you might have atherosclerosis in your peripheral (carotid) arteries. If you develop chest pain or signs of a stroke seek medical attention (call 911) immediately. Heart attacks and strokes are preventable. Don't wait until you have had one and are working on preventing a second episode. Get to work now. Remember, if it is good for your heart, it is also good for your brain.

Or simply feeling tired or having no energy. And a recent study conducted by researchers found a direct link to increased risk of dementia.
